



ST JOHN THE EVANGELIST OLD CHURCH, STANMORE!

In 1632 a new church was built in Stanmore, made of local bricks. It also had a porch of Portland stone, which might have been crafted by Nicholas Stone, master stonemason to both King James I and King Charles I.



The church was central to village life for the next two hundred years. However, Stanmore was no ordinary village, as you'll find out!

A local man, Sir John Wolstenholme, paid for the building of the new brick church. He started his career working in customs, a profitable area of work at that time!

> He married well, giving him connections to powerful families, like Thomas Smythe, an important figure in the East India and Virginia Companies. Sir John joined both companies and held many official offices, eventually becoming an MP.

Sir John also financed explorations to discover a route around the top of Canada to China, the fabled NorthWest Passage. Henry Hudson led the 1610 attempt, he charted whole new areas of Canada and immortalised Sir John by naming several areas after him.

> Henry Hudson, British Sea Explorer

Wolstenholme Fjord NASA William Baffin, another explorer financed by Sir John did the same, naming a fjord and island on the coast of Greenland after his sponsor.Sir John was laid to rest in the church he had built, after living a long and prosperous life!

This episode is in two parts, so keep your eye out for more next Friday St John's church proved to be unlucky for William Laud, Bishop of London, who consecrated the building on the 17th July 1632. William eventually went on to become Archbishop of Canterbury, the most senior member of clergy in the land. However the country was in political and religious turmoil.

William was seen as favouring Roman Catholic doctrines and was despised by the puritan faction of protestantism. The puritan's said that St John's church was actually Sir John Wolstenholme's private chapel and used the fact that William had consecrated it, against him.Eventually he was imprisoned in the Tower of London, and executed in 1645, despite the fact he had received a royal pardon!
